# 2024 Highlights

In 2024, Chosen reached new heights in serving families and advancing our mission. From expanded programs and training to new funding and partnerships, these highlights showcase our impact in 2024.



#### **Direct Care**

Served 1,640 individuals, with 70% successfully completing our parent-directed programs, demonstrating the effectiveness of Chosen's approach.



## **Training Expansion**

Delivered 6,000 training hours to over 1,000 participants and advanced the "Displacing Shame" series on problematic sexual behaviors by filming the introductory course, with plans for a Learning Management System release in 2025.



#### Significant Funding

Received funding from Heart Galleries to support post-adopt families across Texas, as well as an initial investment for the "Displacing Shame" training series.



#### **Service Enhancements**

Secured Chosen's largest grant from Humana Foundation to launch an enhanced model serving the greatest at-risk youth in San Antonio and Houston.



#### **Thought Leadership**

Expanded our reach through 10 strategic partnerships and 12 podcasts, strengthening collaborations for family referrals and training. Our partnership with Proverbs 31 Ministries connects with over 6 million people via their podcast, devotionals, and social media.



## **New Partnerships**

Launched new partnerships with Edgewood Ranch (Orlando, FL) and New Life Residential Treatment Facility (Canyon Lake, TX), while securing new Master of Social Work internship partnerships with University of Texas at San Antonio and University of South Florida.

# 15th Anniversary

In 2024, Chosen proudly celebrated 15 years of life-changing impact for families. This milestone offers a moment to reflect not only on the difference we've made since 2009, but also on the heart and vision that have guided us from the very beginning. What started as a grassroots dream has grown into a nationally recognized organization—a testament to resilience, innovation, and an unwavering commitment to strengthening families. Looking back at our early beginnings reminds us of the transformative power of connection and renews our determination to serve the next generation of families in need.

## **History + Timeline**

## 2009

Chosen began in Jenni Lord's home with a \$500 gift from another ministry funding its first website.

## 2010

Six volunteers organized a marathon, raising \$100,000 to support over 1,000 adoptive families.

## 2011-2014

Chosen hosted races nationwide, funding nearly 400 adoptions and 100 global orphan care projects.

## 2015

Chosen shifted focus from funding adoptions to helping children heal from trauma and strengthening family bonds.

## 2017

Chosen adopted telehealth, expanding nationally to provide support for families across the country.

## 2020

Chosen diversified its revenue model, with training and expanded programs, reducing reliance solely on philanthropy for financial sustainability.

## 2022

Chosen's "Moonshot Vision" established to standardize traumaresponsive and relational connection in a well-being system.

## 2024

Chosen's 100k Strong initiative aims to help 100,000 people heal, expanding content and national trainings like Displacing Shame.



## **The Challenges**

#### Physical safety isn't enough.

The child welfare system focuses on physical safety, but that's just the beginning. Children need more to thrive—connection and attachment to trusted caregivers. We work with families to help children experience healing and well-being.

## Therapy isn't enough.

Many foster care and adoption interventions focus solely on the child, often relying on therapy without supporting the whole family. We believe healing shouldn't fall on the child alone. Caregivers are essential to the healing process, so we equip them with trauma–responsive tools to foster connection and healthy attachment—proven paths to true healing.

#### Trauma-informed isn't enough.

We train our care managers and social workers to be not only trauma-informed, but trauma-responsive in their approach. We equip them with a deep understanding of how trauma affects child development and guide them on how this should change the way we interact with the children we work with to help them heal.

#### Tracking encounters isn't enough.

The status quo tracks encounters, but we focus on healthy outcomes for the whole family. We aim to equip the entire family and prevent issues like hospitalization, placement disruption, and other ongoing challenges. Our approach may not always be the easiest or fastest way, but it is the way that works.

## Sarah & Kyle Hill's Story

## Growing Together: Building a Stronger Family Through Love and Learning

Sara and Kyle's journey began as foster parents taking short-term placements, offering care for a few weeks at a time. But everything changed when they received the call about three siblings who needed a long-term home. That placement, which came with unique challenges, eventually turned into adoption, forever changing their family dynamic.

The siblings, who ranged in ages from 2–4 years old, carried the emotional weight of their past experiences and trauma,



resulting in behaviors
that were difficult for the
couple to navigate. The
two older children often
displayed aggression. In
daycare, they struggled to
manage emotions, leading
to incidents of hitting or
spitting at other kids. The
youngest, who was nonverbal, faced his own set of
challenges, including a deep
fear of bathtime.

"We'd turn on the water, and he'd scream like he was terrified," Kyle explained. "It was heartbreaking."

On top of these challenges, mealtimes became battles. Their daughter was an extremely picky eater, and her refusal to try new foods led to frequent power struggles. Sara and Kyle also noticed their children's difficulties communicating emotions and the need for control that would sometimes escalate into conflicts at home or daycare.

"At first, we didn't know what to expect. Short-term placements were different—you deal with the immediate needs, but this was long-term."

"At that time, every day felt like an uphill battle," Sara reflected. "We were constantly on edge, waiting for them to come home, wondering what challenge we'd face next. It was hard.'

Everything changed when Sara and Kyle began working with Katie, a Care Manager at Chosen. Thanks to a grant from the Florida Department of Children and Families' Father First program, they were able to access coaching



and support completely free of charge.

Katie worked closely with Sara and Kyle, offering strategies tailored to their family's specific needs. She introduced ways to help their youngest son overcome his fear of water.

"Katie suggested taking small steps to build his tolerance, and it worked," Sara shared. "Now, he loves bathtime!"

For their daughter's picky eating, Katie empowered them with techniques like offering choices and setting achievable goals. "She told us to try a 'three-bite rule,' where after three bites of vegetables, they could stop. It took the pressure off and worked wonders."

Sara and Kyle also learned the power of "play" as a tool for communication. When the older children acted out, she encouraged Sara and Kyle to reframe their questions. "Instead of asking, 'Why did you do that?' we'd say, 'I wonder why you...?' That simple shift helped them express their feelings," Kyle explained. "We still use it to this day."

The challenges didn't stop at home. At daycare, their youngest son was bitten multiple times over two months. Katie provided strategies to help the family cope and even offered to advocate for them during conversations with school administrators. When it became clear a change was necessary, Katie guided the children through the difficult transition to a new daycare.

"She didn't just help us manage the immediate issues," Sara said. "She gave us the confidence and tools to support our kids long-term."

Through patience, persistence, and the guidance of Chosen, Sara and Kyle have seen their family transform. Their children are now thriving in a nurturing environment where trust and connection are at the heart of every interaction. "We've come a long way from those early days," Sara shared. "Our home feels like a safe and loving place for everyone now." Their journey is a testament to the profound impact of support and unwavering love.

We serve foster parents, adoptive parents, kinship caregivers, and reunified parents with programs to help them connect with their children. We empower caregivers to build strong, healthy connections and attachments with their child while equipping them to lead change in their family. Our model of care includes:



## **The Monroe Family**

## A New Beginning for a Kinship Family



When Steve and his wife Angela suddenly found themselves welcoming their nephew into their home, they didn't expect the road ahead to be easy. With three sons in their home, adding a new child was a significant shift. But there was a deeper challenge: their nephew had experienced neglect, which brought a host of emotional and behavioral struggles.

We were thrown into it pretty quickly," Steve recalls. "We didn't have

the luxury of time to really prepare. We found out our nephew was moving in, and suddenly, everything changed."

Luckily, Steve had a connection to Chosen through his previous involvement as a donor. "I knew Jenni, the CEO, and had supported Chosen in the past," he explains. "But when we found ourselves in this situation, it wasn't just about donating anymore—it was about getting the help we truly needed."

One of the first breakthroughs came when Steve and Angela learned more about how trauma affects children, particularly in terms of brain development, attachment, and behavior.

"The real unlock for us was learning about trauma and how it impacts everything—brain development, attachment, and even emotional regulation," Steve shares. "Our nephew had been severely neglected, and he was struggling with underdeveloped parts of his brain, which made his behavior even more challenging."

With this new understanding, Steve and Angela were able to reframe their nephew's actions through a different lens. They weren't just dealing with a rebellious child—they were supporting a child who was struggling to trust, to communicate his needs.



For Steve and his family, the first step in the healing process was helping their nephew feel safe. "He had never really felt safe before," Steve says. "And so much of the battle was just about showing him that he was loved and safe, and that we would be consistent, even when things got tough." He reflects on how challenging the emotional rollercoaster was, with moments of withdrawal followed by emotional explosions.

"It was hard, but we learned that trauma affects everything. The emotional ups and downs weren't a reflection of how much we loved him—they were part of the healing process," Steve explains.

In addition to receiving direct support from Chosen, the family was taught how to communicate these insights to their three sons, helping them understand their nephew's behavior in ageappropriate ways.

"It wasn't just about us," Steve says. "We had to make sure our boys also understood."

After months of learning and support, Steve and Angela began to feel more confident in their ability to support their nephew. "At first, it was overwhelming," he admits. "We didn't know how things were going to work. But with the guidance from Chosen, we felt better equipped to handle the situation. We weren't just guessing anymore—we had the tools to navigate it."

One of the most significant moments came when their nephew began to open up emotionally. "He had always kept things to himself, but one day, he showed us a drawing. It might seem like a small thing, but it was huge. It was the first time he let us in on something personal," Steve recalls.

This moment of vulnerability was a sign that their nephew was beginning to trust them.

"The art was just a small part of a bigger picture," Steve reflects. "It showed us that he was starting to feel safe enough to let us in."

One afternoon, after a minor conflict between the boys, their nephew shared something profound with Steve and Angela. "He said, 'I need to stop lying to myself about what happened to me,'" Steve says, his voice full of emotion. "It was the most clearly he had ever talked about his past, and he said it in front of the other boys. It was a big deal."

Steve and Angela's journey shows the power of patience and unconditional love in helping a child heal. Their story is a testament to the impact that connection and support can have on building family.
